Following our conversation today I understand that,

A parishioner is claiming that the council trespassed their land and destroyed/damaged their bushes. Parishioner wants the bushes compensated stating that the council illegally trespassed on their land.

This would seem a public liability claim – that the parishioner is claiming that the council damaged their land/property.

I can confirm that Borough Green Parish Council hold public liability with [REDACTED]. Attached is the policy schedule (see page 6), public liability certificate and policy wording (see page 37).

In the event that the parishioner wants to go ahead with a new claim, please give them the council policy number and claims details.

I also understand that the council has hired a solicitor to word a letter to the parishioner. There has yet to be a claim but if there was a claim the council will not be using this solicitor.
